## ONE-DAY WORKSHOP ON 'DRAFT NATIONAL EDUCATION POLICY-2019'

The Government of India has an agenda to use education as a catalytic tool to transform the future of children and youth of India, with a specific focus on quality education, innovation and research, aiming to make India a knowledge superpower. It is argued that the draft National Education Policy will strive to equip the students with the necessary skills and knowledge compatible to current times and useful for national development. However, on the other hand, it is doubted on the ground that it would be detrimental to the interest of underprivileged sections of the society and against the social justice. On this background, the second one-day workshop on 'Draft National Education Policy-2019' was organized on 21st January, 2020, in which around 110 the students and faculties from 10 affiliated colleges covered under the cluster, participated.

Prof. Sudhakar Mankar, Former Head, Dept. of Commerce, Shahaji Chh. Mahavidyalaya, Kolhapur and activist of Shivaji University Teachers'(SUTA) inaugurated the workshop. Beforehand, Dr. Naushad M. Mujawar, Head of Department of Commerce of the host college and Co-ordinator of the workshop, presented the theme of workshop and introduced the resource persons. The inaugural function concluded with the vote of thanks given by Dr. D.S. Kamble after presidential remarks of Prin. (Dr.) Vijay A. Mane.

The first session on '**Draft National Education Policy-2019: Recommendations'** was conducted by Prof. Sudhakar Mankar, in which he reviewed almost all vital recommendations. He argued that the prevailing system of higher education comprised of 799 universities and 39071 affiliated colleges inclusive of 1800 women colleges is not altogether ineffective. However, the recommendation to convert around 800 universities and 40, 000 colleges merely into 10, 000 to 15, 000 institutes will forcefully divert all those, who do not afford to obtain admission to these institutes, to Open and Distance Education mode. Along with this, the financial autonomy is likely to endanger the 'access' and 'equity'--- the basic components of the social justice policy of government. Further, the condition of minimum 5 lakh population for a college would result in the closure of many colleges operating in rural and tribal areas.

Moreover, there will be three types of institutions namely (i) Type-I: Research Universities (ii) Type-II: Teaching Universities & (iii) Teaching Colleges, which will be energized by granting them autonomy, providing them public financial support and encouraging the private philanthropic efforts. This means that there will be complete end of affiliation system, which is likely to be a serious impediment to the growth of higher education in the country.

In the second session on 'Implications of Draft National Education Policy-2019', Dr. Subhash Jadhav- Head, Dept. of Economics, D.R. Mane Mahavidyalaya, Kagal, mentioned that Government of India has been spending only 2.74 percent of GDP on education, which is very meager, compared to many other countries of the world. He further argued that the implementation of National Education Policy-2019 in its present form would create serious social problems, as the large chunk of society is likely to be deprived from the quality education.

Six participants expressed their opinions about the theme and organization of the workshop. The workshop was concluded with the vote of thanks expressed by Asst. Prof. Mr. Toufik Nayakwade .Asst. Prof. (Mrs.) Ghorpade and Asst. Prof. (Miss.) Mohini Anchaliya compered for the workshop. All participants were offered Certificates of Participation at the hands of the resource persons.
